### 4. FIRST AID MEASURES

**EYES:** Immediately flush eyes with large quantities of water for several minutes, while holding eyelids apart. Remove contact lenses if easy to do so. Continue rinsing. Get medical attention if irritation or bonding occurs.

**SKIN:** Wash with soap and water. Get medical attention if irritation develops or persists.

**INGESTION:** If swallowed, do not induce vomiting. If conscious and alert, give two glasses of water. Seek medical attention.

**INHALATION:** Remove to fresh air. If not breathing, give artificial respiration. If breathing is difficult, give oxygen. Get medical attention.

#### SIGNS AND SYMPTOMS OF OVEREXPOSURE

**EYES:** Symptoms may include tearing along with a severe burning sensation. Permanent damage to eye tissue likely if material is not removed quickly.

**SKIN:** Contact causes skin irritation.

**INGESTION:** Aspiration hazard. If swallowed, vomiting may occur spontaneously, but do not induce. If vomiting occurs, keep head below hips to prevent aspiration into lungs. Call a physician immediately.

**INHALATION:** Prolonged or excessive inhalation may cause respiratory tract irritation.

**ACUTE EFFECTS:** Irritating to eyes, respiratory system and skin.

**CHRONIC EFFECTS:** Prolonged or repeated contact can result in defatting and drying of the skin which may result in skin irritation and dermatitis (rash).

### 5. FIRE FIGHTING MEASURES

**GENERAL HAZARD:** Flammable liquid and vapor.

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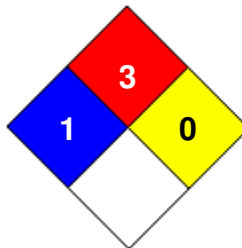
